NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION (NCTE)

The National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), in its previous status since 1973, was an advisory body for the Central and State Governments on all matters pertaining to teacher education, with its Secretariat in the Department of Teacher Education of the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT). The National Policy on Education (NPE), 1986 and the Programme of Action there under, envisaged a National Council for Teacher Education with statutory status and necessary resources as a first step for overhauling the system of teacher education. The NCTE as a statutory body came into existence in pursuance of the NCTE Act, 1993 (No. 73 of 1993) on the 17th August, 1995.

Objectives:

The main objective of the NCTE is to achieve planned and coordinated development of the teacher education system throughout the country, the regulation and proper maintenance of Norms and Standards in the teacher education system and for matters connected therewith. 4<u>.</u>

NCTE is going to revise norms & standards and regulations according to NEP-2020. Now NCTE is preparing draft and regulations for Teacher Education programme i.e. B.Ed, MEd, BPEd. MPEd. DLEd. All these programmes will be one year Teacher Education programme (B.Ed,) two year Teacher Education programme (B.Ed,), Four year integrated Teacher Education prgramme(B.Ed,). MEd. Programme will be of two year and three year.

Presently two year B.Ed and MEd programme is running in the Department

ABOUT REHABILITATION COUNCIL OF INDIA (RCI)

The Rehabilitation Council of India(RCI) was set up as a registered society in 1986.On September,1992 the RCI Act was enacted by Parliament and it became a Statutory Body on 22 June 1993.The Act was amended by Parliament in 2000 to make it more broad based. The mandate given to RCI is to regulate and monitor services given to persons with disability, to standardize syllabi and to maintain a Central Rehabilitation Register of all qualified professionals and personnel working in the field of Rehabilitation and Special Education. The Act also prescribes punitive action against unqualified persons delivering services to persons with disability.

Objectives of RCI

- 1. To regulate the training policies and programmes in the field of rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
- 2. To bring about standardization of training courses for professionals dealing with persons with disabilities.
- 3. To prescribe minimum standards of education and training of various categories of professionals/ personnel dealing with people with disabilities.
- 4. To regulate these standards in all training institutions uniformly throughout the country.
- 5. To recognize institutions/ organizations/ universities running master's degree/ bachelor's degree/ P.G. Diploma/ Diploma/ Certificate courses in the field of rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
- 6. To recognize degree/diploma/certificate awarded by foreign universities/ institutions on reciprocal basis.
- 7. To promote research in Rehabilitation and Special Education.
- 8. To maintain Central Rehabilitation Register for registration of professionals/ personnel.

- 9. To collect information on a regular basis on education and training in the field of rehabilitation of people with disabilities from institutions in India and abroad
- 10.To encourage continuing education in the field of rehabilitation and special education by way of collaboration with organizations working in the field of disability.


11.To recognize Vocational Rehabilitation Centers as manpower development centers. 12.To register vocational instructors and other personnel working in the Vocational

1-G-PROGRAMMS DOCTOR OF PHILIOSOPHY (Ph.D.)

11:

A Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) is the most common degree at the highest academic level awarded following a course of study in the department of education. Ph.Ds are awarded for programmes across the whole breadth of academic fields. Because it is an earned research degree. Those studying for a Ph.D. are required to produce original research that expends the boundaries of knowledge. Normally in the form of thesis and defend their work before a panel of other expert in the field.

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya (GGV) offers Ph.D. programs leading to the award of Ph.D. degree through its Departments / Research Centers. The award of Ph.D. degree is in recognition of high academic achievements, independent research and application of knowledge to the solution of problems in all subjects /branches of knowledge as notified by the University from time to time. Creative and productive inquiry is the basic concept underlying the research work.

Vishwavidyalaya, Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) Degree Regulations, 2018". In order to regulate the minimum standards and procedures for award of Ph.D. degree in conformity with the University Grants Commission (Minimum Standards and Procedure for award of Ph.D. Degree) Regulations-2016, Dated 05 May 2016, and in exercise of powers conferred in Ph.D. ordinance 2016 of Guru Ghasidas Page 2 of 29 Vishwavidyalaya the following Regulation is promulgated to make provisions for Ph.D. admission registration, submission, evaluation and award of Ph.D. degree in different Schools of Studies of the University. Those candidates who have been registered for Ph.D. before the promulgation of this Regulation would be governed by the earlier Ordinance/Regulation issued from time to time under which he/ she had been admitted. The degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) of the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur shall be conferred on a candidate who fulfills all the requirements specified in the relevant Ordinance/ Regulations. A candidate shall ordinarily be permitted to pursue research for the Ph.D. degree in the subject in which he/she holds Master's degree. However, a candidate willing to pursue research in allied/ Inter-disciplinary areas may co-opt a co-supervisor as prescribed in these regulations. Further the registration will be in the subject in which the scholar held Post-graduate degree. Ph.D. program through distance education mode is not allowed by the University.

ADMISSION ELIGIBLITY

Applicant for admission to the Ph.D. program shall have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational Institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions. Provided further that the students appearing for final year or final semester of their post-graduate degree

examination will also be eligible to appear for the admission process subject to the fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria in the final result thereof.

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

There would be two streams of applicants, namely

- 1. Applying against available seats in a subject which shall be filled by Vishwavidyalaya Research Entrance Test (VRET)
- 2. Applying against available seats in a subject which shall be filled by candidates not appeared in VRET i.e. called VRET-Exempted category.

75% of total seats available in a department will be reserved for VRET applicants and remaining 25% seats will be reserved for VRET-Exempted category applicants. This percentage will also be maintained while distributing seats among teachers of the department. In case of fraction of percentage of seats under VRET and VRET Exempted Category, the mathematical rule of rounding off number shall be followed. In case, at any point of time VRET exempted category applicants are not available after two continuous admission notices of such seats, seats may be converted to VRET category. Also, at any point of time if VRET category applicants are not available after Page 6 of 29 two continuous admission notices of such seats, seats may be converted to VRET exempted category. In both cases of conversion of seats will require competent approval from Dean of the School.

1-J- FACILITIES FOR THE STUDENTS

15:

There are number of facilities are available for the students

CAMPUS:

The greenest, bio - aesthetic exquisite campus enriched with clean and fresh environment spreads over an area of 655 acres. Along with the scholarly ambience, the campus also comprises of extra- academic facilities needed for the enhancement of all-round development of the students.

COMPUTER CENTRE:

The University has modernized computer centre with several versions of Linux and Windows operating systems to compliment computer literacy. A large number of peripherals such as printers, LCD projectors, scanners and other multimedia devices are handy for users. The internet connection is provided to all. It also maintains University website www.ggu.ac.in (250 web pages) which provides all the relevant information and notifications regarding the university's happenings

WOMEN'S STUDIES DEVELOPMENT CENTRE:

Women's Studies development centre is the first centre of Women's Studies development in the state and was entrenched in 2005. The centre concentrates on the raising consciousness and knowledge of gender equality and equity issues through participatory activities.

TRAINING AND PLACEMENT CELL:

It's backed by School placement cells which aims to act as an association between industry and the university. The cell takes care of all the activities to make the students employable and self-reliable. Recently, many companies/Industries having International dignity like TCS, Sake Solutions Wipro BPO Satyam Services Private Limited have recruited are bright scholars.

HOSTEL FACILITIES:

Four hostels, three for boys and one for girls separately, provide accommodation to 800 approx boys and 430 girls. Two more girls Hostels of capacity 200 will be available very soon for allotment. Vishwavidyalaya faculty member as Warden supervises each hostel. The university aims to provide a comfortable lodging and boarding services to the students keeping in view a home away from the home. Admission in hostels is based on merit as per university rules and the students will be required to apply in the prescribed application form.

CAFETERIA:

New Cafeteria Building with G+1 floor was constructed with grant-inaid from UGC XI plan. It is situated behind university auditorium. It has one big cafe-seating hall of 25m x 16m at ground floor. The Cafeteria is successfully catering to the daily needs of the university community. The Cafeteria remains open on all working days from 8.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m HEALTH CENTRE: Health facilities are available for students and residents of the campus under the able guidance of a Medical Officer and other visiting specialist, as per needs. Specialist from CIMS also visit the health center in the campus from time to time for specialized checkup & advice.

STUDENT CREATIVITY CENTRE:

University has developed Student Creativity Centre in which various types of facilities including indoor games such as table tennis, Chess etc are available. Entertainment facilities and leisure time reading magazines are kept for the personality development of the students during their off time. The centre is run and maintained by the constituted student council under the supervision of Dean, Students welfare.

TARANG- THE UNIVERSITY MUSICAL BAND:

It is the university's musical band which is a student managed group. Every year, 09 students is recruited in the group.

AUDITORIUM:

The campus has fully developed Auditorium with a seating capacity of about 800 audiences.

GYMNASIUM:

Well-equipped and ultra modern gymnasium has been established in the campus for students.

SPORTS CENTRE:

The University has fully furnished Sports Centre to promote athletic expertise of youth.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES CELL:

As per UGC during XI plan, University has coaching facilities for SC/ST, minorities, OBC and other weaker section students. Coachings presently running in the campus are: NET coaching scheme Remedial coachingscheme Entry level coaching scheme.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING CENTRE:

As per guidelines of the MHRD, Govt. of India and State Govt. of Chhattisgarh, State Mental Health Hospital, Sendri, Bilaspur under the National Mental Health programme, the university has established the Psychological Counselling Centre on 29th November 2016.

SC/ST CELL:

As per UGC guidelines, the university possesses a separate SC/ST cell which processes and provides assistance to the SC/ST students.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS), NATIONAL CADET CORP (NCC):
