Background

The theme of the workshop is 'Cyber Crime and its Prevention'. The massive increase in technological developments in personal computing, smart phone and wireless devices in recent years has created significant challenges in the Asia-Pacific region and beyond.

Cyber crime investigation is different in many ways from the conventional crimes and presents serious enforcement challenges. There is no physical contact between the victim and the perpetrator of the crime and, quite often, they are situated in different countries, thousands of miles apart. This practically rules out availability of eyewitness account. Availability of presentable documentary evidence rapidly diminishes over time, which calls for a quick incidence response. Cyber laws are still in the evolving stage. Most of the agencies associated with criminal justice administration face knowledge and capacity constraints. Majority of offences require investigations abroad, which involve compliance of time taking procedural formalities. This important workshop will explore the expansion of technology-enabled crimes and how collaboration can inform technological, legal and policy responses internationally.

Objectives of the Workshop

- 1. To identify the emerging Cyberlaw, Cybercrime & Cybersecurity trends and jurisprudence impacting cyberspace in today's scenario.
- 2. To create far more awareness about the newly emerging kinds of cybercrimes that is impacting group of people and individuals in the digital and mobile ecosystem.
- 3. Cybercrimes are now beginning to impact individuals in their new avatar. What are the major international Cyberlaw, Cybercrime & Cybersecurity trends? What kind of new manifestations of cybercrimes are beginning to emerge that corporates need to be careful of? What international best practices need to be kept in mind by individuals for protecting themselves from being victims of Cybercrimes? What kind of overall anti Cybercrime strategies do people need to have in place? These and a variety of other issues are sought to be addressed in the workshop on Cyber Crime and it Prevention.
