ORDINANCE FOR THE ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TO THE UNIVERSITY

(For Regular on Campus Mode)

[Act – Sections 6(xviii), 28(1) (a)]

1. Application form for admission to various programmes offered by the University shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time.
2. The last date for the receipt of applications for admission to various Schools of the University shall be fixed each year by the Academic Council.
3. The last date for admission to the Schools of the University shall be fixed each year by the Academic Council.
4. No person shall be qualified for admission to the University unless he/ she is sixteen years of age before the first day of July in the year in which he seeks admission Or, if he/ she is admitted with the approval of the Academic Council to the second year of the degree course, seventeen years of age before the first day of July in the year in which he is admitted or, if he/ she is admitted to the first year of the M.A., M.Sc., M.Com., LL.B., or B.Ed. Course, nineteen years of age before the first day of July in the year in which he seeks admission or if he/ she seeks admission to M.Phil./ Ph.D. Course he is 22 years of age.
5. No person shall be admitted to any post-graduate course unless he has passed a degree examination from the University or an examination recognized as equivalent to a degree examination of the University.
6. The number of students to be admitted in a course of study in an academic session shall be prescribed each year by the Academic Council.
7. Admissions to the Undergraduate / Postgraduate programmes shall be made on the basis of VET or any other mode as prescribed by the competent body. The syllabus and paper for the same shall ordinarily be of 10+2 and Graduate level respectively.
8. Courses offered in the University shall be as prescribed by the Academic Council from time to time.
9. Admission to the programme leading to the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy shall be governed by the concern Ordinance.
10. Such candidates who satisfy the requisite qualifications may be considered for admissions on the basis of the academic record, and/or performance of the applicant at any entrance test/viva voce as may be prescribed in respect of each programme.
11. 15% of the seats in the academic programmes/programmes offered by the University shall be reserved for students belonging to Scheduled Caste, 7½% for students belonging to Scheduled Tribe and 27% for students belonging to Other Backward Classes. Provided that the University may also make such special provision for the admission of candidates belonging to the physically handicapped and such other disadvantaged groups on
