1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 UNIVERSITY AT A GLANCE

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, established as the state University in 1983, is a residential University, named after Guru Ghasidas, an eighteenth century Satnami saint. The University was upgraded to a Central University under the Central Universities Act, 2009 during the XI Five Year Plan. The University is an active member of the Association of Indian Universities and Association of Commonwealth Universities. National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has accredited the University with a B status.

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya is located on the outskirts of the city of Bilaspur, popularly known as Nyayadhani (the city of Justice) and Sanaskardhani (the city of culture). Bilaspur is a cosmopolitan city, which houses High Court of Chhattisgarh, the headquarters of South East Central Railways and South Eastern Coalfields Limited. The journey of the University began in a humble way with a few departments in temporary buildings in Bilaspur city. Subsequently, it was shifted to the old army barracks of Second World War in the Koni area, located on the left bank of the river Arpa. The University campus is spread over 656 acres of land. Nature has bestowed the campus with unmatchable beauty, immaculate blend of green areas and water bodies.

The University offers opportunities to young minds and facilitates the accomplishment of their creative talent with emphasis on character building through various streams of knowledge. The University comprises of 32 University Teaching Departments under 09 Schools of Studies. It offers number of undergraduate and postgraduate programs, besides diploma and postgraduate diploma courses. Admissions to all the programs are made through a competitive All India Entrance Test conducted by the University. Admissions to the Institute of Technology (IT) and Department of Management Studies are made through All India Engineering Entrance Examination (AIEEE) and Management Aptitude Test (MAT), respectively. During 2016-17 academic session, 6867 students in the teaching departments of the University have been enrolled.

Chhattisgarh, formerly an undeveloped region, is one of the fastest growing states in the country. As an industrial hub, the state requires sizeable pool of skilled manpower. The denizens of this area can tap these opportunities in a better manner by attaining quality education and training. The University has taken extensive steps to transform both teaching and learning process in order to meet contemporary global standards. To boost the quality of teaching, the University has appointed nationally and globally trained faculty members. The University is also committed to meet an ideal student-teacher ratio. The classrooms are being modernised by installing facilities like LCD projectors, quality furniture and air conditioners where require. Students are continuously evaluated through internal assessment, assignments and end semester examinations. The transparent evaluation process, where answer-sheets of the internal assessments are shown in the classrooms, helps the students to improve their performance. To maximize student's potential, the University has arranged excellent support facilities including hostels, cafeteria, gymnasium, student amenities centre and Wi-Fi connectivity. Through various classes—remedial, spoken English, personality development and free coaching for competitive examinations—the University is committed to guard equal opportunities for students belonging to traditionally marginalised Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward classes.

Special measures have been taken to provide an environment conducive for over all personality development of students. The Central Library has more than one lac forty thousand books and subscribes to a number of national and international journals. Apart from the Central Library, most of the departments have their own departmental libraries. Adequate sports facilities are available in the campus and hostels. The University has planned to extend sport facilities by constructing a new gymnasium. Throughout the year, many activities are organised including Republic Day, Independence Day, Foundation Day, Education Day, Swami Vivekanand

Jayanti, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel Jayanti, Teachers Day, Guru Ghasidas Jayanti to make the campus vibrant. Along with sports and cultural activities, students are also encouraged to participate in social outreach initiative of the University. Through these activities, students are encultured in participatory ways of life. International and national level events are organised to expose students to new ideas of eminent persons from all walks of life. The University teaching departments organise fieldwork, industrial visits and educational tours to impart practical knowledge. To inculcate leadership qualities among students, the University has successfully constituted the students' council. The students' council represents all the students of the University as per provisions of the act.

To face challenges posed by the process of development, the University community is all set to contribute to the larger society through quality research and development in the various areas including energy security, food security, biodiversity management, pollution management, forest management and developmental policy. The UGC Human Resource Development Centre regularly organises Orientation and Refresher Courses, Short Term Courses & Workshop for the capacity building of teachers and staff. During these courses, expertise of senior faculty members of the University and practitioners from diverse fields is utilised. In the coming years, the University aims to act as a role model for the central Universities and simultaneously provide an educational opportunity to the growing number of the students of the region. The University is on the path of realising twin goals envisioned by the National Knowledge Commission; "of making higher education more relevant to the needs and opportunities of a knowledge society" and "to make higher education more accessible to all sections of the society."



2. ACADEMIC ORGANS

2.1 SCHOOLS OF STUDIES

The University offers various courses through 32 Departments under 9 different Schools of Studies. The present set-up of School of Studies and Departments is as follows:

2.1.1 ARTS

The five departments under the School of Arts are: English, Hindi, Journalism & Mass Communication, Library and Information Sciences, and Physical Education & Sports. The departments under the School cover a wide range of courses and research interests.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH & FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Established in 1990, the Department of English and Foreign Languages has been endeavouring to provide the students a firm grounding in English studies in a very congenial atmosphere of teaching and learning.

The interest in literary studies can be seen in the growing number of undergraduate students who opt for English as their honours or elective subject. Students aspiring to obtain a post graduate degree in Literature in English get introduced to all the important aspects of literatures written in English. We are also aware of the importance of research. Accordingly, our syllabi incorporate the latest aspects of literary studies and research so as to prepare the students well for research and teaching. The Department is also a recognized research centre with all facilities.

A stimulating ambience in the Department, regular seminars, assignments and special invited lectures on specific portions

of syllabus enhance the purpose of imparting quality education. In addition, text reading sessions, group discussion and literary and extra-curricular activities are regularly organized. All this is supported with a well-stacked departmental library, access to reputed journals, and free access to high-speed internet available in the Department. With the availability of all these, the department has become a hub of activities. The students participate actively in extracurricular activities, and even organize a drama festival 'Abhinaya' every year.

The academic excellence of the faculty members reflects in the continuous publications and participation in national and international conferences and workshops. The students have also been presenting papers at seminars and conferences and have been appreciated. The number of our students clearing UGC NET has been increasing every year. Teachers have been to and from USA under Fulbright Scheme for teaching purposes. The Department seeks to have further involvement in collaborations for exchange and visit of scholars to and from different national and international institutions. Our recent activities include a workshop in English and communication skills' and a course in "Reading and Appreciating Literature" under an MHRD scheme, GIAN. The Department also arranges for teaching of English and Communication skills to students of various other departments as well as for Remedial English classes, teaching of English in classes for NET, UPSC and other competitive examinations, and also for English teaching in special classes for SC/ST Students.

Placement record is excellent, with most of the former students teaching in prestigious schools and colleges in various parts of the country. In addition, many of the students are in good positions in administration, media, animation and other diverse fields.

The vision of the department is to establish the department as a centre for continued growth, expertise, and contextual research in English Studies and to develop a deepened understanding of language and literature

and the value of critical understanding and effective writing.

The objectives of the department are to develop sensibility in the students for the English language and literature, to incorporate in the teaching-learning process a wide perspective by including works of world literature in the syllabi, promoting research in new areas and on inter-disciplinary topics, to make the Department and the classroom a hub for academic activity and for opening up the latent potential of the students so as to develop their personality too, to explore and reach out to academicians, institutions and bodies for research and academic activities, to develop interactions between literary and other forms of cultural production, to enhance students' proficiency in English language skills and to promote interest in and learning of foreign languages.

Activities of the Department:

- The Department organized a 10-day course 'Reading and Appreciating Literature' under the GIAN programme of MHRD from 11 to 22 July 2016. A total of 32 participants attended the course. 2.1.4 LIFE SCIENCES

The school of Life Sciences consists of five departments. These departments work in unison to achieve the common goals of the university in the area of their respective fields. These departments are: Anthropology and Tribal Development, Biotechnology, Botany, Forensic Sciences and Zoology. The departments under the School cover a wide range of practical courses and research interests.

DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROPOLOGY AND TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Anthropology was established in the year 1989. It is one of the oldest departments of the University. The department plays a vital role as Chhattisgarh harbours a substantial tribal population with diverse cultures. Anthropology, as a science of people, has a strong potential to work for the welfare and allround development of the weaker sections of the society of the State as well as of the country.

The department has a cultural and archaeological museum. The course contents also deal with issues and concerns covering different dimensions of human rights and development. The departmental field work has been conducted on the tribal's inhabiting remote areas. The department also completed a number of research projects on topics like Rehabilitation and Displacement, Nutritional Status of the Hill Korwas, Tribal Indebtedness, Monograph and Village Studies. The department works in close collaboration with the local NGOs for productive research and development. The department has maintained a library consisting of more than 750 books. With up-gradation of laboratory infrastructure, the department has revised the syllabus taking into account the national requirements of the students.

The main objectives of the department are to generate qualified, skilful and committed anthropologists; to play a catalytic role as social advisers to policy makers in matters relating to tribal development, empowerment and tribal health; to study and suggests remedial measures with respect to eradication of hunger and malnutrition; and to reduce mortality and morbidity incidences among tribal and non-tribal population of Chhattisgarh. The department also aims at creating awareness among tribal population of Chhattisgarh with respect to their rights enshrined in the Constitution of India.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

Established in 2009, the department has grown into a well-recognized Centre for higher learning and research in Plant Sciences. The department has a well-stacked library with more than 2000 books and over 150 online scientific journals, which cater to the research needs of the faculty and the students. The aim of the department is to provide quality education to the educationally underprivileged tribal state Chhattisgarh. The department is operating several research projects funded by various National and International agencies. The faculty members of the department have produced quality research publications in reputed national and international journals with over 300 research publications to its credit since the inception of the department. Research activities of the department are spread over 9 laboratories with each faculty supervising one laboratory. 23 doctoral students and one post doctoral fellow constitute the core group working in these laboratories.

The departmental laboratories are equipped with advanced instrumentation facilities like Gas Chromatograph, Photo-microscopy with Leica (DM200) Microscopes, PCR thermo cycler, Kjeldhal, Phytotron etc. Moreover, the department also extends facilities of RT-PCR, Chemi-Doc XRS, HPLC, LC-MS/MS and Atomic Absorption Spectrophotometer. The department has recently established a plant tissue culture, plant cell & molecular biology lab and a bioinformatics lab with computers connected to broadband internet facility. The curriculum offers four broad specializations, viz., Functional plant biology; Ecology & environmental biology; Natural Resource Utilization, Ethnobotany & Pharmacognosy; and Microbiology

The Department of Zoology is one of the first departments to be established by Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya after its upgradation to the status of the central university in the year 2009. In the short span of merely eight years the department has presented itself in the forefront of major areas of Life Sciences. Presently, department has developed into a full-fledged centre of teaching and research excellence in modern biology. The vision of the department is to conduct quality teaching and research in all the branches of Zoology and produce students who are well versed with the subject and are able to contribute to society and international community.

The course structure and content delivery methods provide substantial opportunities for interactive learning and exposure to research. Many innovative teaching practices are the highlights of this program. Students performance is assessed throughout the semester by a continuous system of tests, seminars, assignments, mid and end-semester examinations. The Department has focused on developing experimental skills through live experimental designs, both by UG & PG students.

The Department has developed teaching programs with stress on the uniformity principles of molecular and cellular mechanisms in all living systems which are very close to the human being. A complete and thorough study of these mechanisms could help the basic Zoologists understand the clinical side of the subject. At present the department has 07 teaching faculty members who are actively engaged in their respective field of research specializations. The thrust area of research includes Neuro-endocrinology, Neuroscience, Toxicology, Fish and Fisheries, Reproductive biology, Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Entomology and

The department laboratory contains most of the necessary instruments that are required to carry out theory and practical classes smoothly. Instrument rooms with all the necessary sophisticated instruments required

for conducting basic and applied research work are available in the Department.

The departmental library contains 1450 books for all the major areas of Zoology. Apart from this, students and faculty members also use the resources available at the Central Library on campus. Apart from the library the museum of the department is also very rich and contains various specimens belonging to all the major animal phyla and is used for teaching and demonstration purposes.

DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

The Department of Computer Science & Information Technology (CSIT) was established in the year 1990, with one year P.G. Diploma course (PGDCA). This course was followed by a Master's degree course in Computer Science as well as in Information Technology, M.Sc.(CS) and M.Sc.(IT) in 1996. Subsequently, Master of Computer Application (MCA) course approved by the All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi was introduced in the year 1998.

The Vision of the department is creating, transmitting and applying Knowledge to improve the social, cultural and economic quality of life of people in the Chhattisgarh and India.

The objectives of the programmes are to prepare students to obtain positions as system analysts, systems designers, Programmers and managers in any field related to information technology. The program, therefore, aims at imparting comprehensive knowledge with equal emphasis on theory and practice. MCA, M.Sc(CS) and B.Sc(CS) students are encouraged to spend a full semester working in the industry with an aim of giving them insight into the workings of the IT world. However, the course curriculum has enough flexibility to enable a student to undertake advance studies in computer science later on.

The department has a large number of branded PCs with latest configurations. Every student is providing with enough time for hands-on practice on these machines. CSIT has got its own departmental library besides Central Library. The department provides Internet facility in the Computer Center, which is used as lab of CSIT in the same building. The department has well qualified faculty members who continue to have interaction and collaboration with other national and international universities and institutions. The faculty members of the department are actively involved in R&D activities. A large number of research articles in national and international journals and proceedings have been published by the teachers. They have beenalso invited to deliver invited talks in India and abroad. Expert lectures are conducted in the department from time to time. The students are motivated to develop realtime projects and assigned software development live projects, preferably in reputed organizations.

Department of CSIT revises its course curriculum frequently, looking at the needs of the industries and endeavoring to place our students therein and has a close interaction with software and R&D organizations. The passing-out students have an excellent placement record and are able to secure jobs across the globe in reputed companies.

The faculty members of the department have an excellent track record to have joint collaborative research work with many eminent Mathematicians in the world.

2.1.7 NATURAL RESOURCES

The School of Studies in Natural Resources has three departments under it viz., Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences; SLT Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Department of Rural Technology & Social Development.

DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY, WILDLIFE & ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES

The Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences is a premier centre in the state imparting forestry education since 1988-89. It has also taken the lead role in forestry education and research in Central India. The department has been following the modern syllabus developed by ICFRE/ICAR for BSc and MSc Programmes. The syllabus is focused to develop integrated knowledge and skills relevant to forestry and allied subjects and is also designed to prepare them for various competitive exams such as IFS, SFS, ARS etc. Our vision is "to promote excellence in education, research and extension in forestry and allied subjects to cater the need of trained man power for practicing sustainable forestry and its protection and conservation in the region and country".

Objective of the department is to provide a bigger catchment and platform for wide spectrum of students to choose forestry as a professional degree, to promote excellence in education and research in Forestry and allied subjects and to provide the students with innovative knowledge and skills and cater the need for trained forestry man power in the country.

Trainings of the students in rural and forest villages, forest industries, academic and research institutes are an integral part of the curriculum. It is intended to develop practical knowledge, to expose in industrial and research environment and to promote entrepreneurship skills among the students. UG and PG students are also required to have compulsory attachment to the State Forest department, biosphere reserves, national parks, wildlife sanctuaries etc for the exposure of forestry work operation.

Curriculum of the degree programme is designed to impart essential scientific / technical and administrative competence to the forestry science graduates so that they are ideally suited for the positions of Range Forest Officer (RFO) and Assistant Conservator of Forest (ACF). The graduates have a wide scope of job opportunities like nursery and plantation managers, technical assistants and managers in forest based industries like pulp and paper industries, small scale and cottage industries etc.

Presently the department runs in well spaced building with laboratories located behind luxirios plantation of *Peltaphorum*. Construction of one more building is almost completed where workshops, museums and advance research laboratories will be established. The Department is equipped with laboratory facilities such as CHNOS, Total Carbon Analyser, Windias, Leica compound microscope, Stereo microscope, Photosynthesis analyser, Microtome, Meteorological station, Total station, Spectrophotometer, Ozone analyser, Remote sensing based softwares etc. Glass house and forest nursery are maintained for research and practical purposes for students and Scholars.

Activities of the Departments:

The Department celebrated **World Forestry Day** on 21 March, 2017 and organized litter art competition, photography and Painting competetion for all departments of the University.

On 5th June 2016, the **World Environment Day** was celebrated by the department. On this occasion, saplings of Forest species were planted by the Vice-Chancellor in the University Campus.

The S.L.T. Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences was established in 1997 with an objective to develop professionally competent manpower in the field of Pharmaceutical sciences. The institute is duly approved by All India Council of Technical Education, New Delhi and Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi. The institute has been imparting quality education with the help of well-qualified faculty members and state-of-the-art laboratories having sophisticated instruments. The institute is equipped with a rich library that includes textbooks, reference books and journals.

The vision of the institute has always been to provide the best facilities to the students to develop them as the potential leaders in research and entrepreneurship in various sectors of health profession. It has been the only institution from the Chhattisgarh State that has been ranked 31st among the top 50 pharmacy institutions of India by National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2016-17. The laboratory of institute has been updated by construction of the platforms for the practical work as well as for the installation of the instruments.

DEPARTMENT OF RURAL TECHNOLOGY AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Rural Technology and Social Development was established in the year 2001 with the aim of overall development of rural students through teaching & research activities. The indigenous knowledge of the rural people has been utilized by the department for creation of need-based technologies for sustainable rural development. Presently, the department runs professional and job oriented Bachelor, Master and Doctoral

Degree courses in Rural Technology and these courses are approved by University Grants Commission, New Delhi.

The Department runs in its existing building with constructed area of 543 square meter and its extension with 869 square meter area. Several advanced scientific instruments are also available in the Department, for teaching, research and conducting project work of undergraduate and post graduate students. New Accelerated Solvent Extractor (ASE 150) has been installed for innovative research in the field of medicinal plants. The Remote Sensing laboratory is equipped with latest Remote Sensing GIS Softwares ERDAS 2011, ArcPAD, and 21st century GIS for research in this area. The Department has furnished a laboratory with the aim of working on plant extraction, herbal drug formulations and their safety evaluation. The Department has developed many demonstration units *viz.* Vermicomposting, Biocomposting, Apiculture, Sericulture, Lac production and Mushroom production *etc.* Currently, six major research projects are running in the Department with the help of different funding agencies.

The pass out students have obtained employment in different Government and non-government sectors *i.e.* Rural Engineering Services, *Zila Panchayats*, NGOs *etc.* Most of the pass out students have been selected or secured employment in Rural Engineering Services of Chhattisgarh Government. Besides this, a number of pass out students have also established their entrepreneurship and every necessary technical help and guidance is provided to them by the Department for this purpose.

The Department offers UG, PG and Ph.D courses in Chemical Sciences. There are four major specializations offered in M.Sc. such as Analytical, Physical Chemistry, Inorganic Chemistry and Organic Chemistry. The department has two laboratories possessing necessary and sufficient chemicals, reagents, glassware, labwares and basic instruments for performing experiments in physical, inorganic, organic and analytical chemistry, in general and synthesis, analysis (qualitative and quantitative) and characterization of different inorganic and organic compounds in more particulars.

The departmental library has sufficient number of books and fulfils the requirement of the faculty members and students.

The faculty members of the department have significantly contributed to scientific world through research publications and have received many distinguished national and international awards and fellowships such as JSPS Postdoctoral Fellowships, ORISE, USA Postdoctoral fellowship, Canada Post-doctoral Fellowship, NSC, Taiwan postdoctoral fellowship, BK21 and KOSEF postdoctoral fellowship, South Korea. The mission of the department is to contribute to the training of a wide spectrum of students of Science and engineering by offering relevant curricular inputs related to pure and applied physics. Research & development and consultancy activities are being carried out to achieve self-sufficiency in Hi-Tech Materials, devices and instruments. The department has grown and emerged as the leader of the science education in this region of central India. The department offers teaching and research programs in Experimental & Theoretical Condensed Matter Physics, Experimental Materials Science, Experimental Nuclear

Physics, Spectroscopy and Plasma Physics. The department offers UG, PG and Ph.D programme in Physics & Electronics. Advanced material characterization facilities such as Laser Raman Spectroscopy, Scanning Electron Microscopy, EDAX, Atomic Force Microscopy, Fourier Transform – Infrared spectroscopy, UV–Vis Spectrophotometer and X–ray diffractometer etc are available in the department.

Department has its own library which provides rich resources for both students and researchers. Department has successfully installed a 3.0 MV high current Pelletron Accelerator facility in the National Centre for Accelerator Based Research (NCAR). This facility has made an important stand in the national map as one of the emerging research department. This facility has provided opportunity to carry out inter-disciplinary research work in various branches of science and is the first such facility in any Indian University. It is also first accelerator in terms of the highest beam current in whole country in this category.

The vision of the department is to be dynamic, inclusive and competitive in teaching, learning and research in Physics and to ensure that the scientific, engineering and technical requirements of the students are addressed. The mission of the department is to provide Physics courses relevant to the professional needs of students and pursue research and development work to keep the faculty in tune with scientific methodology and stay abreast of recent developments.

The department organises dynamic academic activities by organizing regular seminars, inviting eminent science personalities, conducting workshops, and symposia which provide excellent opportunities particularly to the UG/PG students of the department. The department has its own training and placement cell, which trains students for national level entrance examinations and looks after their placement at various research institutes and industry. Students of the department are encouraged to appear for national level examinations like, NET, GATE, JEST, JAM etc. the department is striving very hard to improve the quality of Physics education with an aim to stand out as one of the leading science education centres in the country. In its previous avatar, the centre was serving the University since 27st March, 2009 to cater to the need of in-service training and orientation of academic and non academic staff of higher education institutions. It plays a crucial role in the holistic development of teachers. The training programmes viz., Orientation programme, Refresher courses, short term courses, interaction programmes, workshops, seminars are regularly organized as per the guidelines of UGC, New Delhi. HRDC has excellent class rooms with audio-aisual, internet and multimedia facilities; create an ambient environment for interactive learning.

State-of-the-art ICT Laboratory with high speed internet facilities further provide opportunities for participants to learn the soft skills through hands on training from time to time during programmes. HRDC has its own library with an ample number of books and digital resources to meet the needs of resource persons and participants.

The Central Library of the University also extends facilities of INFLIBNET, Science Direct, e-resources, books and journals to HRDC. The HRDC provides good facilities of guest house, medical facilities and transport to the participant and resource persons. Eminent academicians and researchers are invited as resource persons for delivering talks in the training programmes. Highly motivated faculty, state of the art facilities, excellent logistics, and ambience are the strengths of HRDC and key to the successful organisation of quality programmes.

This HRDC envisages propagation of the values of quality education and train the teachers to become intellectually enlightened, morally upright, emotionally balanced, socially committed, patriotic, eco-friendly and accomplished individuals and also to become sensitive to the demands and the needs of the students in their journey towards achieving the goals and objectives of higher education.

The HRDC aims to help the academic and non-academic staff to understand the linkages between education and economic and socio-economic and cultural development; to acquire and improve basic skills of teaching to achieve goals of higher education; to keep abreast of the latest developments in their specific subjects; to understand the organization and management of a college/university and to perceive the role of teachers in the total system; development of personality, initiative and creativity; and to promote computer literacy as well as Internet knowledge among the university staff.

Activities of the Centre:

Eleven (11) training programmes were organized by HRDC during 2016-2017 for enhancing the skills and capacity building of teaching and non-teaching staff of Universities/Colleges. Four hundred thirty (430) participants from 18 different states Viz. Andaman & Nicobar, Telangana, Kerala, Tamilnadu, Madhya Pradesh, Bihar, Delhi, Maharashtra, Arunachal Pradesh, Orissa, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal, Pondicherry, Nagaland, Assam and Chhattisgarh benefited from these programmes. - Infrastructure was created of Rs. 4,97,414=00 from registration fee as per the UGC-HRDC guideline during the financial year 2016-17.

2.4 National Centre for Accelerator Based Research, Department of Pure & Applied Physics (Supported by UGC & DAE-BRNS)

Introduction:

Guru Ghasidas University, after its upgradation as a central University, took a bold step for establishing a 3.0 MV Pelletron based Accelerator machine in the Department of Pure & Applied Physics.

This Accelerator based Interdisciplinary Research Centre on the initiative of the then Vice-chancellor. The basic objective of the Centre has been to boost the Research & Development in various areas of Science & Technology for further research in understanding mechanisms responsible for materials modification through ion beam interaction and other interdisciplinary areas and to bring the ion beam technology in the university campus so as to provide internationally competitive environment for research in the niche areas of science. This has been conceptualized and initiated as a flagship program of the university.

Consequently, establishment of 3.0 MV Pelletron accelerator facilities was initiated in March 2010 after executive council of the University approved the programme and in 2014 the facility was commissioned as National Centre for Accelerator based Research in the Department of Pure & Applied Physics.

In 2012, University Grants Commission (UGC) approved the establishment of this centre and in 2015 sanctioned the technical positions for its operation.

All radiation safety requirementshave been followed and due permissions for various stages has been obtained from Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB). AERB team completed radiation safety inspection in December, 2014 and the recommendations of the AERB committee have been received in February, 2015. A trial beam experiment was ontained in 2015 which was extended up to final operation permission being granted. Final safety analysis report (FSAR) was discussed and approved by AERB and this institute and RSO has been registered through eLORA (an e-governance portal of AERB). Currently, the machine operation final permission is awaited for compliance of calibration of radiation monitors and procurement of neutron pocket dosimeter.

In June 2013, Department of Atomic Energy (DAE) Government of India under Board of Research for Nuclear Science (BRNS) financially supported the programme in phased manner and provided 4.5 crores for the first phase. The DAE-BRNS project (first phase) was extended March 2017. However, the visit of the DAE-BRNS project Monitoring Committee is due this year and we are asking for one more year extension of the programme. UGC has also sanctioned one post of Professor for the centre and Inter University Accelerator Centre (IUAC) promised technical support and exchange of researchers through MoU.

The installation of the accelerator was completed in March 2014 and the FIRST BEAM was obtained on November 12, 2014 and finally the test report was accepted on 23.11.2014.

Scope of interdisciplinary Research at NCAR

Energetic ions ranging from few KeV to MeV have played significant role in various areas of Science & Technology. Probing ion-solid interaction using energetic ions from low energy accelerators have recently emerged as an important area of research in various fields of Science & Technology. The accelerator based interdisciplinary research centre provides state of the art research facilities through ion beam irradiation, ion implantation and ion beam analysis techniques for pursuing frontline researches in the areas of material science, nanotechnology, environment sciences, polymer chemistry, archaeology, material chemistry, conservation of bio-diversity, life sciences, biotechnology, pharmaceuticals, molecular biology, etc. The details of ion beams, ion beam analysis techniques, current for various ions (positive and negative) as well as parameters for ion implantation are available on NCAR webpage (http://ggvncar.co.in/about.html).

Notable achievements during the period:

The tender for the items to be procured including Low energy beam line, target preparation laboratory equipments and electronic workshop instruments against DAE-BRNS grant after due permission from PMC of DAE-BRNS have been submitted to University authorities for approval.

· Request for Appointments of technical staff sanctioned for the centre from UGC has been submitted

- and the process is underway.
- · Proposal for constitution of national User committee is also submitted.
- The cente has taken up maintenance of machine and successfully rectified the problems. The major maintenance taken up are as given below in brief.

Problem 1: 09.05.2016: RBS vacuum was not getting build-up. The fault was detected as Turbo pump controller was showing error message "too high load". The problem was resolved after Turbo pump bearing was changed.

Problem 2: 14.07.2016: High loss current was detected along with possibility of dust inside the tank. Annual maintenance of accelerator tank was performed. Problem resolved.

Problem 3: 14.07.2016: There was low beam line vacuum. The fault was detected and after changing the rough pump oil the problem resolved.

Problem 4: 21.12.2016: Low & high energy Column currents were not equal. The fault was detected through systematic diagnostics. The tank was opened and 03 numbers of spark protection strips were found damaged and replaced. Problem resolved.

Problem 5: 13.04.2017: High energy Column current is zero and low energy column current is less than actual value. The spark protection strips were again found damaged and replaced.



5.3.2. Proctorial Board

Discipline is an essential and important aspect for the overall development of any academic institution. The Vishwavidyalaya has constituted a Proctorial Board that is duly approved by the Executive Council. The Proctorial Board assists the Vice-Chancellor in exercising her powers related to disciplinary actions. The members of the Proctorial Board are appointed by the Vice-Chancellor from the Teachers of the University in the manner as prescribed in the ordinance. For the maintenance of discipline and general conduct of the students in the campus, the Proctorial Board takes all necessary steps to maintain the respect of all individual and treat them with human dignity.

To combat ragging and avoid any untoward incidence in the University, discipline committees and antiragging committees have been constituted in all schools of the University. On any motion moved by the departmental discipline committee, the board recommends suitable actions to be taken against those found guilty after a primary enquiry. Inside hostels, the administrative authorities appointed by the University maintain the discipline and thus assist the Proctorial Board. Any matter found in violation of the rules is brought into notice of the board for further action. All students are required to submit an undertaking at the time of admission before the concerned head of department to the effect that they will not get involved in any type of misconduct and will abide by the anti-ragging rules.

In case of any report obtained from anti-ragging committee the Proctorial Board conducts enquiry and recommends suitable punishments as per rules against those found guilty. With the assistance of Central Security System of the University, the Proctorial Board maintains the discipline and order during various celebrations like foundation day of Vishwavidyalaya, Guru Ghasidas Jayanti on 18th Dec, Convocation, Election of Student Council and other events/ activities where large gathering of students are common. In this Academic Session of 2016-17, the Proctorial Board has issued more than 6,000 Identity Cards to students of the Vishwavidyalaya.

The University Proctorial Board includes a Chief Proctor and nine Assistant Proctors representing various schools and departments of the university. Professor Pradeep Shukla has been appointed as the Chief Proctor of the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya (A Central University) Bilaspur Chhattisgarh. During the year, some of the cases were reported and referred to the Proctorial Board, which were examined and suitable actions were taken in each case which includes suspension from the University, Class or Hostel, expulsion from the hostel and financial punishments.

5.3.4 Residential Facilities Boys' Hostel

Established in 1989, Swami Vivekanand Boys Hostel consists of 228 rooms & total capacity 475, two common halls and one recreation hall. The hostel has provided accommodation to 452 students (Gen.-138, SC-71, ST-24, OBC-209 and PH-Gen.-04, OBC-04, SC-02). For the allotment of room, the hostel strictly follows reservation policy as per rule.

Two separate mess facilities were available for students which were run by hostel students on cooperative basis. Facilities such as cycle stand, reading room, common-hall, recreational hall, and sports facilities like table tennis, carom board, badminton, etc. are available. Five water coolers, each equipped with water filter devices, are available at convenient locations.

One new boy's hostel (make-shift) "Type IV Boys Hostel" located at new residential campus was established in 2012.

The hostel has provided accommodation to 124 students (Gen.-37, SC-26, ST-13, OBC-43 & PH Gen. 05). This Hostel has been specially allocated for B.Tech. 1st year students. Separate mess facility is available for residents of Type-IV Boys Hostel. Facilities such as cycle stand, reading room, common-hall, recreation hall, two water coolers equipped with water filter devices and Sport facilities like carom board, chess etc. are also available.

Apart from these, one more separate hostel is also available in the university for students of forestry department exclusively. Presently forestry hostel has provided accommodation to 33 students (Gen.-11, SC-06, ST-01, OBC-15).

One hostel library is also available in the hostel, which has been developed through donated books of the university members by organizing book donation camps under the program, "PRAYAS". In this library, books are collected every year by the students of hostel through donations from students, teachers & officers of the university.

Girls' Hostel

The University Girls hostel was established in 1989 to provide accommodation to the girl students. Since then, the hostel facilities have been improving every year. Our main aim is to provide calm, safe, educational and family atmosphere to hostellers so that they can fulfill their dreams for their bright future. The hostel provides accommodation to 432 girl students. The category wise total number of girls accommodated in the hostel is Gen-147, OBC-159, SC-57, and ST-32 in the academic session 2016-17.

Existing Facilities and Developing Facilities:

- Every year the existing facilities are upgraded in hostel as and when required.
- Cleanliness and other infrastructural maintenance like timely white wash, paintings are ensured.
- Inspite of already existing facilities like mess, medical aids, proper security, TV rooms, Hindi and English news papers etc., the hostel is also equipped with internet connection and wi–fi facilities.
- Two Fax machine are available in the hostel so that the hostel inmates can receive parents' permission for going outside and receive other urgent document at any time.
- All wings of the hostel are provided with separate water cooler attached with water purifiers for cool and purified water.
- We have provided induction heater in all wings for boiling and cooking the necessary food items to hostel inmates for 24 hours.
- Generator facility is also available in the hostel.
- Beautiful garden and greenery along the hostel boundary adds to the aesthetic beauty of it.
- Facilities for outdoor and indoor games like badminton, table tennis, carom and chess are available in the hostel.
- Two Chhattisgarh Government home guards (lady) have been placed for day and night care of the hostel inmates.
- The approach road towards C-Wing of the hostel has been constructed by Fabre block tiles.
- Gardens are facilitated with swings and beautiful fixed chairs for the purpose of recreation to hostel inmates in their leisure time.


5.3.7 UDAAN-The Official Students' Magazine

6. COMMON FACILITIES

Since it's up-gradation to a Central University, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has made a number of concerted efforts to develop new support services and strengthen the existing ones. A brief description is as follows:

6.1 ACCOMMODATION

Jawahar Atithi Griha

The Vishwavidyalaya Guest House, located amidst lush green surrounding and pollution free environment, has 16 well-furnished and air-conditioned rooms to provide comfortable stay to visitors to the Campus at a reasonable charge and 01 air conditioned conference hall for meetings. To serve delicious vegetarian food to the guests at reasonable charges, a well-equipped kitchen operates within the guest house premises. At present, all the rooms are equipped with television with DTH system. Refrigerators have been installed in 08 rooms. Four VIP rooms have now been equipped with direct dialing telephone facility.

Forestry Guest House

The Forestry Guest House was established with a grant-in-aid received from Indian Council for Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), Dehradun. It has 31 rooms. The guest house is surrounded by different forest tree species. The guest house provides temporary accommodation to visiting teachers, research scholars and students. The guest house has a well-equipped modern gymnasium. All the rooms are well furnished. Presently, the forestry guest house has been temporarily converted into a girls' hostel to meet the increasing demand of accommodation for girl students.

New International Guest House

The International Guest House is constructed with a grant-in-aid from UGC XI plan. It is newly constructed building with G+ 2 floors. It has five VIP suites, 38 rooms, one party hall and Gymnasium. It is located at the elevated southern area of campus and surrounded by the lush green area.

Residential Facility for Employees

The University extends residential facility to its employees. Presently, there are 60 staff quarters for different categories of non-teaching staff of the University. The staff colony is very well connected by roads with well-lit avenues. The colony is surrounded by lush green trees and has a pleasant environment. A 'Kali' temple built near the quarters provides a space for peaceful meditation and for occasional social celebrations. Residential facilities for employees in the campus are as follows:

6.2 AUDITORIUM AND CONFERENCE HALLS

Rajat Jayanti Sabhagar (Silver Jubilee Auditorium): To commemorate Silver Jubilee Year (2007) of the University, a centrally air-cooled auditorium with a seating capacity of about 800 persons was constructed. Apart from annual events, such as, convocation ceremony and celebration of Guru Ghasidas Jayanti, Central

University Foundation Day and Teachers Day, a number of cultural programmes, seminars, discussions and lectures are hosted in the auditorium.

Conference Hall (with Smart Class facilities) Located in the administrative block of the university, the fully air-conditioned conference hall can accommodate up to 100 persons. The conference hall is a multipurpose venue for holding meetings, seminars, workshops, Ph.D. viva-voce and various co-curricular activities and is equipped with all the latest audio-visual facilities.

Mini Conference Hall In addition to the main conference hall, an air-conditioned mini conference hall is located on upper floor in the administrative block of the university with a seating capacity of about 40 persons.

6.3 CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library was established in the year 1984 as a part of the University to meet the academic needs and requirements of the students, teachers and research scholars. It is housed in a spacious building, having seating capacity of more than 500 persons at a time. Its collection comprises of 1, 44773 books, Indian and foreign scholarly journals and 1438 Ph.D. theses. The library uses SOUL 2.0 software for automation and to access the e-resources, free Internet and Wi-Fi facilities have been made available to the users. The library provides RFID based services as well as reprography to users along with Current Awareness (CAS) and SDI services.

6.4 CAFETERIA

The University Cafeteria in its present form came into existence in 2009. It is managed by a team of dedicated teachers, non-teaching staff and students. The Cafeteria is successfully catering to the daily needs of the university community. The Cafeteria remains open on all working days from 8.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. On special

occasions, the cafeteria opens on holidays too. Devbhog-the upfront brand of Chhattisgarh State Cooperative Dairy Federation has opened a counter at adjoining part of the Cafeteria which provides quality milk and milk products at the most reasonable prices to the students and staffs of the university.

New cafeteria Building with G+1 floor is constructed with grant-in-aid from UGC XI plan. It is situated behind university auditorium. It has one big cafe-seating hall of $25m \times 16m$ at ground floor. There are five big halls on the first floor, the total built up area of the cafeteria is 1005 sg.m.

6.5 CENTRAL SECURITY SECTION

The University is spread over more than 656 acres of land, which houses a number of buildings, laboratories, residential apartments, guest houses, hostels, forest lands with precious species of trees and water bodies. To maintain security of this widely spread campus, university created Central Security Section. The Central Security Section comprises of one in-charge, one assistant security officer and five security supervisors. It works under the University administration and is responsible for the security of the campus. For this, the University campus is divided into four sections – the North, the East, the West and the South. Every zone is looked after by Assistant Security Officer and Security Supervisors and the Assistant Security Officer inspects each zone from time to time. The coordination between the University administration and contractual security agencies is also maintained by the Central Security Section. The duties of the Central Security Section also include: regulating traffic inside the University campus, systematizing parking facilities and assisting the Proctorial board in maintaining discipline in the campus.

6.6 HEALTH CENTRE

Health Centre is located in the centre of the University Campus. Health Centre has a Male Ward, a Female Ward and a Pathological lab and caters to the needs of the students, residents of the campus and employees of the University. One Medical Officer along with assisting staff compounder, ANM (Female) and Ambulance driver is posted at the centre. From time to time, specialist doctors visit the Health Centre. At the same time, patients requiring further treatment are referred to Medical College (CIMS) or Apollo Hospital. All the medical facilities, treatment and medicines for students and employees are provided free of cost. A total of 10,868 patients were examined and treated at the health centre during the session. The Health Centre has an Electro Cardio Grapy (ECG) Machine and a chemical Blood Analyser for carrying out various blood tests. The Health Centre also provides twenty four hours ambulance services and doctors on call are available round the clock. The Centre also has limited in-patient facility.

6.7 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell has become one of the major mechanisms for quality assurance within the university system. The IQAC was reconstituted in the University in April 2016 for planning, guiding, monitoring, quality assurance and evaluating the quality improvement as well as for further enhancement of quality. The committee held its first informal meeting on Aug. 25, 2016 and took several resolutions for quality improvements. The academic plans of various departments were accordingly collected and presented to the Development Section for further implementation. The exercise of student's feedback was also undertaken with the help of identified faculty members for the odd semester of 2016-17. A proposal for review of academic achievements at departmental level and consequent plan of action to revamp the academic quality has been submitted to the University.

6.8 MEDIA CELL

The Media Cell of the University is functional since October 2009, which works as a window of the university to the society. Its main objective is to act as a liasioning agent in the University-society-media interface. One of its main functions is to send news and information to the media on behalf of the University. Apart from sending

news and information it also reports different events and activities inside the University.

The present Media Cell comprises of a Professor as In-charge, Public Relation Officer and other members who are nominated by competent authority from time to time. Presently, the Media Cell office has its executive office situated in the Administrative Block and is facilitated with latest configuration desk top computer with internet facility, printer, scanner, laptop etc. which is looked after by PRO.

The Cell also stores news items published in different newspapers related to the University. The Cell has its documentation centre where photographs and videos of the Vishwavidyalaya are stored in print as well as in digital version. It provides the soft and hard copies of news items and photographs of different events as and when required. The Cell has its own digital still camera with video recording for coverage of events and activities of the Vishwavidyalaya. The documentation centre of the cell helps the University, departments, staff and students to get the video and photographs according to their needs.

6.9 OFFICIAL LANGUAGE CELL

The Official Language Cell was established in Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya in 2009 working as an independent cell. The objective of Official Language Cell is to follow the Official Language Act 1963, Rule 1976 and Official Language Policy in the university as well as to ensure the implementation of the policy and guidelines of Official Language Department, MHRD, GOI as directed from time to time. It is remarkable that our university is in 'Ka'- region. As per guidelines, an official language committee has been constituted under the chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor. For review of the use of Hindi as an official language, this committee meets once in every three months. Official Language Cell is committed to implement Official Language Policy in the university. As per Official Language Policy all the name plates, notice boards and seals have been made bilingual. All the forms and documents are also being made bilingual.

Achievements:

In collaboration with UGC-MHRD, a one-day training workshop was conducted on November 26th, 2016 for the employees of the university giving information and mode of functioning of Rajbhasha Policy, in which 39

employees participated. This office translated the Statutes and Ordinance from English to Hindi. Official Language Cell also organized a program on 14 September, 2016 on the day of Hindi Divas. On this occasion, lecture was delivered by senior author, writer and columnist Retd.(IAS) Dr. Sushil Trivedi on the topic 'Media Mein Hindi Ka Bdalta Swarup'. On February 16, 2017 Official Langage Cell organised a Kavya Goshthi. Dr. Raj Malkapuri (Bilaspur), Shri Banshidhar Misahra (Bilaigarh), Shri Krishn Kumar Bharteey (Chicholi, Nandghat), Mrs. Rashmi Gupta (Bilaspur), Shri Devendra Parihar (Mungeli) and well renowed folk artist Shri Laxman Masturiya participated in this goshthi. Hindi officer Akhilesh Tiwari participated and presented e research paper in All India Rajbhasha Sangoshthi, dated March 19 to 21, 2017 held in Mahatma Gandhi International

Hindi Vishwavidyalaya Vardha (MH).

6.10 POST OFFICE AND BANKING

The residents and students on the campus have been provided with banking and communication facilities. The Post Office, Bank of India and the Punjab National Bank are rendering these services. The Post Office is located near the west corner of the University premises and offers services such as, 'Speed Post' service, telephone bill depositing and other facilities. A new electronic telephone exchange has also been established on the campus. The State Bank of India and the Punjab National Bank ATMs are located on the campus and are available round the clock; however, ATM of Bank of India is available only during banking hours as it is within the office.

6.11 RIGHT TO INFORMATION (RTI) CELL

Right to Information Act 2005 has been implemented in the University. During 01 April 2016 to 31 March 2017, 218 RTI applications were received. The applications were sent to the concerned Public Information Officers for providing the information to the applicants. During the period, 50 applications for first appeals were placed before the First Appellate Officer for disposal.

RTI Cell regularly sends the monthly report to the Ministry of Human Resource Development and Central Information Commissioner for information. Under RTI annual return information system, quarterly return is also uploaded on CIC website well in time in every quarter.

6.12 SPORTS FACILITIES

The Physical Education and Sports Department of the University provides and maintains the sports facilities on the campus. The existing sports facilities include, two floodlit basketball courts, Volley Ball courts, Cricket, Tennis, floodlights, four Kho-Kho grounds, Badminton courts, Kabaddi courts, Modern Gym, Table-Tennis Hall, Hand-ball ground, Football ground, and Badminton courts in Girls' and Boys' Hostels. These facilities are used by the students, teachers and employees of the campus for their regular sports activities and also for organizing special sports events and competitions at various levels. Training by specialized coaches is provided to the students. The construction of a swimming pool of Rs. 1 Crore is in progress.

6.13 SCHEDULED CASTE (SC) / SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) CELL

The University has established a SC/ST Cell as per the UGC guidelines in November 1988. The Cell provides assistance to the SC/ST students to receive scholarships as per the government rules and also deals with their problems regarding this. The Cell also observes the reservation policy pursued by the academic departments with regard to admissions. The main objectives of the Cell are:

- To assist the SC/ST, OBC, minorities and physically challenged students from Chhattisgarh as well as outside C.G. states in getting scholarships.
- To document the details of the SC/ST, OBC, minorities and physically challenged students.
- · To help the students through counseling.
- To liaison with the government officers at the district and state level in and outside state Chhattisgarh regarding various scholarships.

Reservation and Relaxations Specific to Admission

In accordance with the policy of the Government of India and the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, the University has reserved 15% of seats in each course for candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes, with a provision for interchangeability between the categories, wherever necessary 27% seats are reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC category. The relevant certificate for OBC has to be obtained from the same authorities as

mentioned for SC/ST categories. Admission against these seats is provided after the candidate has passed the qualifying examination and has appeared in the Vishwavidyalaya Entrance Test (VET).

Government of India Scholarship

The University provides Government of India's SC/ST Welfare Scholarships to the eligible SC and ST students of the University. The scholarships include reimbursement of admission, tuition, examination and hostel fees on annual basis. The number of students who applied for the scholarship is as follows (from 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017).

6.14 STD/PCO AND PHOTOCOPYING CORNER

These facilities are available on the campus, one in the administrative building premises and another in the Central Library building. The photocopy centre provides photocopying at subsidized rates as prescribed by the University. Along with photocopy, telephone and FAX facilities are also available. These corners also sell stationary items at reasonable rates.

6. 15 TRANSPORTATION

With the addition of many new courses and consequent increase in the strength of students, a strong need was felt to increase the existing transport facilities. to meet this requirement, University buses regularly ply between selected locations in the city and the University throughout the day.

6. 16 UNIVERSITY INSTRUMENTATION MAINTENANCE FACILITY

IMF has been established in the University with financial assistance from UGC. The purpose is to provide instrumentation training, maintenance of general purpose electronic instruments in the University, and to assist in maintaining and upgrading the undergraduate and postgraduate laboratories. The Centre organised a one-week training programme with technical assistance from Western Region Instrumentation Centre (WRIC), Mumbai.

6. 17 INTEGRATED UNIVERSITY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (IUMS)

An E-governance initiative for online integrative academic, administrative & financial processes: In order to transform the campus environment from conventional to smart ICT enabled online digital campus, an Integrated University Management System (IUMS) has been developed for the University by Indian Telephone Industries (ITI) which was inaugurated by Prof. Ved Prakash, Chairman, UGC on 20-4-2013. The system has been executed for making academic and administrative processes online and automatic including smart class rooms. Many of the 21 modules which were designed under IUMS are activated. These modules are executed after data/ server room was prepared as per specifications for installation of the IUMS. The admission process for the session has been done successfully. Some of the IUMS modules are as follows.

The following modules are currently activated under IUMS:

- 1. Financial Accounting: It takes care of all financial accounting related work of our university.
- 2. Academic Module: Offers online services for admissions, enrolment, student databases, course structures etc
- 3. Examination Module: Creates database of all enrolled students, their records of examinations, result

- processing, etc.
- 4. HRMS Module: All processes related to employees for establishment section.
- 5. Employee's Portal-provides online access to the employees to their service related information such as salary, pay slip, service book and offers services such as leave applications, loans, advances, etc to be requested online.
- 6. Guest House: It takes care of guest house room allotment, room availability and related work.
- 7. Student Portal: It is separate portal for University registered students. It provides several facilities to students like student profile, subject registration, subject card, result, teacher feedback, online challan/fee payment etc..
- 8. RTI Module: tracks and processes all RTI related applications and keeps records of such applications including the action taken on each one.
- 9. Legal Module: Provides online access to all legal cases and the status of each case related to the University.
- 10. Hostel: It takes care of student hostel allotment related work like availability, allotment, fee, student
- 11. Court Cases Monitoring System (Legal): It provides all legal cases history record management and related MIS
- 12. Bill Management: It provides facilities to store and finance section to bill payment related work and related MIS.
- 13. Inventory: It provides facilities to store section related work.
- 14. Pre Admission: It takes care of new students' (VET & VRET) admission process in separate portal as per notification. All admission related information like brochure, notification, advertisement, details of seats, policy, new student registration, on line form submission with on line payment facility, course wise roll number generation, all type of related report information are available.

The stakeholders including University teachers, officers, employee and students are motivated to use IUMS for MIS and to move as early as possible to realize the goal of paperless University.

6. 18 UNIVERSITY PRESS

The University Press was established in 1989 as a laboratory of the department of Journalism and Mass Communication. At present, the press is delivering the printing tasks of almost all the necessary works of the University i.e. printing answer booklets, examination application forms for the main and supplementary exams using the rulling machine as well as in the offset printing machine available in the press. The University Press prints the answer booklets for the theory and the practical examinations and also various proformas which are used at examination centre and proformas related to various departments and office sections of the University.

7.1 ANTI -RAGGING COMMITTEE

- In the last academic session (2016-17) 5835 students of different departments have filled the online anti-ragging undertaking.
- The university members of the committee belonging to different schools make frequent visit to their respective schools to ensure ragging free campus and remain in touch with the respective heads of the departments.
- The coordinator of the committee holds a meeting of all the members in the campus from time to time to enquire about the actual facts and to ensure a ragging free environment.

- The entire session remained ragging free.

7.2 ANVESHAN 2016-17 ORGANIZED BY ASSOCIATION OF INDIAN UNIVERSITIES (AIU)

The Association of Indian Universities (AIU) organized *Anveshan:* Student Research Convention, a pioneering initiative to identify and nurture the research talent among the young researchers in the country was organized in three phases, first at University level, second at Zonal level (East, West, North, South, and Central) and the final one at **National Level.** These events were competitive in nature in which innovative and unconventional research proposals were invited in five areas/fields viz., Agriculture; Basic Sciences; Engineering and Technology; Health Sciences and Allied Subjects-Pharmacy, Nutrition etc.; Social Sciences, Humanities, Commerce and Law (Objective and Result Oriented Projects).

As per the direction of AIU, GGV, Bilaspur organized the first phase i.e. University level event of AIU Central Zone Students Research Convention: *Anveshan*, on 15th February 2017 at University Auditorium. Total 22 projects were submitted by the participating students from all the areas out of which only five projects were selected for the zonal level event.

7.6 EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL (EOC)

Equal Opportunity Cell has been established in Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya to provide coaching facilities for weaker section including SC, ST, OBC (Non creamy layer) and minorities. Three different coaching schemes viz., NET (CSIR/UGC) coaching, remedial coaching and competitive examination coaching were organized during the period. The classes of UGC and CSIR NET coaching were arranged in four departments namely: Biotechnology, Physics and Mathematics and Chemistry departments. Twenty experienced and NET qualified faculty members delivered lectures in the CSIR coaching classes while ten faculty members from education, history and other subjects delivered lectures during the UGC NET coaching classes.

Objectives

- To create awareness about the NET (CSIR/UGC) coaching, remedial coaching and competitive examination coaching among the students.
- To provide a suitable platform and skills, to qualify the NET and other exams.
- To organize and conduct seminars, workshops etc. related to enhancing employability.

Achievements: Nearly 441 students were registered for UGC and CSIR NET Coaching.

7.7 GENDER CHAMPIONS

Gender socialization of both boys and girls begins early, and it is important to initiate change processes at a young age to shape attitudes and transform behaviors. Schools and colleges play a major role in this regard, because students spend large amounts of time engaged with peers in such settings. Creating positive social norms in educational institutions that value girls and their rights is important to improve the well-being of girls and achieve long-term and sustainable social changes.

Vision

Gender Champions are envisaged as responsible leaders who facilitate an enabling environment in academic institutions where girls should be treated with dignity and respect. They will strengthen the potential of young girls and boys to advocate for gender equality and monitor progress towards gender justice.

Objectives

- To provide an integrated and interdisciplinary approach to understand the social and cultural constructions of gender that shapes the experiences of women and men in society.
- To make the young boys and girls gender sensitive and create positive social norms that value the girls and their rights.

In order to promote and achieve gender equality, guaranteed by Article 15 of the Indian Constitution, it is needed to change the mode of interaction at all levels viz. home, school, and work-place. In order to increase the outreach for creating an environment that fosters equal treatment, Gender Champions, boys and girls both, above 16 years of age, were enrolled in the university.

7.8 GGV-ALUMNI

Alumni of Management studies participated in the admission process of MBA admission for session 2016-17. Alumni of School of Engineering and Technology participated in Tech Fest 2017. Mr. Manish Dixit (Mechanical Engineering) delivered a talk on "**How to prepare for Campus placement**" and shared his industrial experiences with the students. One of alumni Mr. Shubhans Vatsyayan (Computer Sc. & Engineering) donated 10,000/- (Ten Thousand only) for Tech fest.

7.9 GLOBAL INITIATIVE OF ACADEMIC NETWORKS (GIAN)

During Phase–I of GIAN, five proposals were submitted from the University, out of which only one proposal submitted by the Department of English & Foreign Languages was approved and sanctioned an amount of Rs. 8.16 lakhs by the National Coordinator GIAN. The course was successfully conducted by the course coordinators Prof. Manish Srivastava and co- coardinator Dr. Anurag Chouhan during 11-22 July, 2016. Dr. Wajuppa Tossa, Associate Professor of Western Languages & Linguistics, Mahasarakham University, Thailand, Prof. Z.N. Patil (Pune) and Prof. R.N. Rai (BHU) from India delivered lectures during this course. A total 33 participants from different parts of the country including those form GGV participated in this course. Based on the presence and performance, the participants were awarded with 02 credits.

7.10 INCUBATOR CELL

Incubator Cell of GGV was established and has been actively working since Feb. 2015 for the promotion of the activities related with patents, technology transfer from lab to land and lab to Industry. The ten members Incubator Cell Committee headed by the Nodal Officer, Prof. Vinod D. Rangari, look after the working of the Cell.

The Incubator Cell successfully organized two days Workshop on "Intellectual Property Rights, IP Commercialization and Prevention of Plagiarism" in collaboration with Chhattisgarh Council of Science and Technology (CGCOST), Raipur from 26-27 Feb. 2016. After the above IPR Workshop, the Incubator Cell worked for further promotion of the IPR related awareness among the researchers of the university. The brief details of the activities done by the Incubator Cell are as follows:

- 1. In order to promote collaborative research with CGCOST, Incubator Cell of the University has taken initiative to organize IP Clinic in the month of April, 2016.
- 2. Prof. Rangari, Nodal Officer, Incubator Cell, received an invitation from Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME), Government of India, dated 20 April, 2016 for attending the Investor-Inentor Meet to be organized jointly by MSME, Development Institute, Mumbai and Office of Controller General of Patents, Designs and Trademarks (CG-PD&T), Mumbai on 25th May, 2016 at MSME, Development Institute, Mumbai. This meet was organized to provide inventors an opportunity to present their inventions before the investors for commercial applications.
- 3. The Incubator Cell organized 'IPR Clinic' on 8th Sept. 2016, at Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences, in collaboration with the Chhattisgarh Council of Science and Technology (CGCOST), Raipur. The Incubator Cell received a total of 26 proposals from research scholars and faculty members of various departments of the University. The IPR Clinic was visited by Dr. Amit Dubey, Senior Scientist, CGCOST, Raipur as an expert. During the 'IPR Clinic', the experts from CGCOST gave detailed guidelines to the individual researchers on the basis of their research work. Researchers who proposed to file the patents have been further asked to submit their enquiries with at least 10 key words for further patent search in this regards.
- 4. After the successful organization of the IPR Clinic in the University, the Incubator Cell has collected

information about the most viable research works to be further forwarded for Patent survey to the office of the Council of Science and Technology (CGCOST) Raipur, to check its further viability for the patent application.

- The innovation club member Dr. Ranganath and his team has been working on the innovative idea of synthesizing the 5-hydroxymethylfurfural from waste biomass which is abundantly available in Chhattisgarh.
- Dr. Kalluri V.S. Ranganath, Asst. Professor, Department of Chemistry, a member of the Innovative Club
 participated in the Innovative fair held at Rashtrapati Bhawan on March 8, 2017. Dr. Ranganath has

presented Innovative work on Synthesis of 5-hydroxymethylfurfural which is widely used as a component in the biodiesel, and has been prepared from the biomass using the magnetite nanoparticles.

7.13 MASSIVE OPEN ONLINE COURSES (MOOCs)

The University has approved and adopted the Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM the Regulation, 2016 in the Gazette of India on 19th July, 2016.

A two day's training programme on "Development of MOOCs/E-content" to our university faculty members was organised on 27-28 Feb., 2017. Prof. K. Srinivas, NUEPA, New Delhi (also an advisor to MHRD on MOOCs) was the resource person. 40 faculty members from different departments participated in this training programme.

7.14 NATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH FRAMEWORK CELL (NIRF)

As per the directives of Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), the University has constituted NIRF Cell in the University to collect, process and present data required for ranking of the University under NIRF. The committee held its first meeting on 21.09.2016 and chalked out the procedure and strategies for data submission for overall category, engineering, pharmacy, law and management. In order to submit the data in various matrices as accurate as possible, various sub committees were formed under the overall supervision of coordination with the member of the committees as In-charge of each category and the NIRF submission was completed successfully. A mammoth exercise was undertaken with the active support of Development Section, faculty in-charge from each school and the members of sub-committees and final draft of the NIRF matric was prepared and successfully submitted for evaluation for overall as well as subcategory rankings in Engineering, Pharmacy, Law, Management and Pharmacy. University has been included in the Ranking for the first time and the SLT Institutute of Pharmaceutical Sciences got 35th ranking in that category. NIRF cell also performed the analysis of the published research papers and identified the areas where performance index has been poor. The cell has also made efforts to review the overall strength and weaknesses with regard to the performance parameters in each category in order to improve upon the ranking.

7.15 NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

National Service Scheme, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports Govt. of India, popularly known as NSS was re-launched at University in 2016, involving 350 students under 6 units. 7.19 UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a programme of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India to uplift rural India. UBA programme is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help and build the architecture of an inclusive India. In compliance of MHRD letter dated 24 Aug., 2015 and UGC vide DO No. F.13-13-2015(CU) dated 4 sept., 2015, Vice Chancellor, Prof. Anjila Gupta took initiative and constituted Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell in the Vishwavidyalaya. Dr. K. K. Chandra, Associate Professor, Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental

Sciences was appointed as Nodal Officer along with 04 other committee members to work for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Under UBA, 04 Gram Panchayats (GPs) Pudu, Rigwar, Tendubhata and Umariadadar comprising of 09 villages of Kota Block, Bilaspur, dominated with tribal population have been adopted.

Since adoption of GPs, the UBA team visits these GPs on every Friday interacts with villagers and discusses their problems. At the same time UBA team meets with authorities for the implementation of different schemes in adopted GPs and solutions of village problems. Thus UBA team has played a Vital role in establishing Effective linkages between villages and District Authorities.

- Financial Literacy Camp was organized on 27 June, 2016 at Pachra village of Umariadadar, inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor. Lead Bank Manager, Chief Manager SBI-Rural, Branch Manager SBI, Ratanpur and PNB Chapora were also present during the programme. The rural people were motivated on benefits of Bank account, Aadhar linkages, Pradhan Mantri Bimayojna, Mudra Loan, Kisan Credit Card etc. About 250 participants of adopted villages were benefitted from this camp. Ten beneficiaries were provided with Pradhan Mantri Mudra Loan for starting of different rural businesses.
- Two health camps were organized jointly with Health Department and UBA team of the University at

Computer literacy classes organized in High school Umariadadar under UBA

Umariadadar and Pudu on 4 Nov. and 9 Dec., 2016. Vice-Chancellor, Collector Bilaspur District, Chief Health and Medical Officer and other district level Officers attended and encouraged villagers for health checkup and treatments. In these camps walkers and mosquito-nets were distributed to the elderly and to other villagers. Total 700 villagers benefitted from these health camps.

- UBA team motivated rural people including women and school students in the construction and use of toilets under Pradhan Mantri Swachha Bharat Mission programme. Besides this, UBA team regularly visited and monitored the progress of the mission and as a result, Rigwar Gram Panchayat has been declared Open Defecation Free (ODF) while toilet construction is in full swing in other GPs.
- Due to efforts of UBA, a proposal of High School, Pudu for upgradation to Higher Secondary School has been sent to C.G. Department of Education by district Collector.
- Pradhan Mantri Ujala Scheme was propagated in all adopted GPs and more than 200 families received LED bulb free of cost. Similarly UjwalaYojna has also been promoted in UBA adopted villages. As a result more than 150 families benefitted with LPG connections while more than 300 families have already applied for gas connections.
- Massive plantation drive was initiated during July to September and 15,00 plants of Kathal, Lemon, Amrud, Mango etc were distributed to 200 families of Rigwar, Tendubhata and Umariadadar GPs. Due to efforts of UBA team, State Forest Department, Bilaspur also distributed 20,000 Eucalyptus seedlings to 72 farmers under agro forestry scheme in these GPs.
- Demonstration of bio-culture Trichoderma was done at two farmers' fields at Pachra in Paddy crop with the objective to promote organic farming in the area. The result was encouraging.
- Attachment of B.Sc. and M.Sc. Anthropology students was done for a 10-day study tour at Umariadadar and Ttendubhata GPs in April 2016 and March, 2017, where family level micro data were collected and tribal livelihood and society structure were studied.
- All units of National Service Scheme (NSS) of this Vishwavidyalaya have been attached to UBA adopted village for social works. Total four NSS units' camps of one week duration were camped at Umariadadar, Tendubhata and Pudu GPs in which NSS volunteers have contributed in road maintenance, pond digging, awareness development on health and hygiene, use of toilet and girl education in these villages. One day camp was also organized at Pachra by 50 NSS volunteers.
- Two classes on computer literacy were conducted in Higher Secondary School Pudu and Higher Secondary School, Umariadadar in which 60 students of X class participated.
- UBA team sensitizes and motivates students during their visit to the adopted villages. With the efforts of UBA team and help of Education Department of the University and guidance rendered from Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, 13 students of B.Ed. III Semester were attached for 2 months during February and March for internship program to Pudu, Umariadadar and Rigwar government schools for teaching works. All B.Ed. students camped in allotted villages and taught the subjects to middle and high

school students.

 One yoga camp was organized jointly with Aayush Department, Bilaspur, during 27 to 31 Jan., 2017 at High School, Pudu.

7.20 YOUTH PARLIAMENT COMPETITION

A two-day workshop was organized in Puducherry on 11-12 Jan., 2017 by Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs in which various coordinators from various universities and colleges of the country were trained for the 14th Youth Parliament Competition. During February-March 2017 a meeting of the cultural coordinators of various faculties was organized and around 55 students from different faculties were selected. After the selection, the students were trained in the matters relating to the Indian parliament and parliamentary affairs. 
