VET SYLLABUS

Syllabus for B.A. (Honours) in History under School of Social Sciences

There shall be one paper of 102 minutes (Two hours) duration carrying 300 marks containing 100 multiple-choice questions.

These questions shall be based on General Awareness, Current Affairs, Basic Science and Elementary Knowledge of History, Political Science, Social Studies, Social Issues and Economics. The questions will also include 10 questions on language to test the students' proficiency in either Hindi or English.

The students have to compulsorily answer 10 questions on either General English and Comprehension of General Hindi and Comprehension.

The paper will include two sets of multiple choice questions in Hindi and English, where the candidate is required to answer either the Hindi language set or the English language set but not both.

The standard will be of 12th Examination or equivalent.
