Department of Management Studies, GGV, organized a one-day National Seminar on “Start-ups and Entrepreneurship: Moving Towards a Self-Reliant India” on December 5, 2023, at Rajat Jayanti Sabhagar, GGV. The seminar focused on the role and importance of start-ups and Entrepreneurship to make India self-Reliant. The inaugural session of the Seminar started with Saraswati Vandana along with lighting the lamp by the dignitaries on the daisat 10:30 am, followed by welcoming Prof. Alok Kumar Chakrawal, Hon’ble Vice Chancellor GGV, Prof. Manish Srivastav, Registrar, Mr. Milind Khankhoje, Circle Head-DGM, Punjab National Bank, Bilaspur, Keynote Speaker of the session, Prof. Irala Lokanandha Reddy, School of Management Studies, University of Hyderabad, Prof. Bhuvana Venkatraman, Prof. B.D. Mishra and Dr. B.B. Pandey. Deans and Heads of Different Departments of GGV, Faculty Members, Students, and all the Participants were also welcomed. Continuing with the program, the welcome address was given by Prof. B.D. Mishra, Head, Department of Management Studies, and the Convenor of the National Seminar. Also, Prof. Bhuvana Venkatraman, HOD, Commerce, addressed the audience and briefed her view on the theme of the Seminar.



<Inaugural Function>

Mr. Milind Khankhoje, Circle Head-DGM, Punjab National Bank, Bilaspur who was the chief guest of the seminar, addressed the audience. He highlighted the key role of banks, specifically public sector banks, in growth and development of startups in India. He emphasized the need of Self-

reliant India in the present era by discussing the situation raised during the Covid Pandemic period. He mentioned the different schemes of GOI for Startups and the role of banks therein. The Key Note Address was given by Prof. Irala Lokanandha Reddy, School of Management Studies, University of Hyderabad. He shared his research work and talked about the strength of India as a youngest Nation. He presented several economic data and said that India will be third-largest economy in the world in terms of Nominal GDP by 2027. He, however, stated that in terms of Purchasing Power Parity, India is already the third-largest economy of the world. He focused that during the last 10 years of the journey of economic growth the role of Startups is very significant. He also added that present government's policy is not only focused on economic growth but also on social growth with the help of NEP-2020.

The Registrar of the University, Prof. Manish Srivastava in his address throw the light on importance of startups and entrepreneurship in making India Socially and economically Self-reliant.

Prof. Alok Kumar Chakrawal, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of GGV, in his presidential address motivated the students to become self-reliant. He stated that for startups and entrepreneurship risk taking ability and determination is required and students should focus to choose the venture that attract them. He emphasized that start-ups are the need of nation today and everyone, especially students of Commerce and Management, should make efforts to develop new ventures that show the sense of nationalism. He also emphasized that in the way of developing the ventures and for growth our steps should be ethical, conscience, authentic and as per law of land.

The inaugural session is ended with the vote of thanks which was given by Dr. B. B Pandey of Department of Management Studies. The souvenir of the National Seminar was also released by dignatories on the dias. The anchoring was done by Dr. P.S. Dwivedi of Department of Management Studies.

In the seminar total 112 research papers in three technical sessions were presented. In one offline session total 54 papers were presented by different participants which was chaired by Prof. Irala Lokanandha, School of Management Studies, University of Hyderabad. While in 02 online sessions, which was chaired by Prof. Pavnesh Kumar, Department of Management Sciences, Mahatma Gandhi Central University, Motihari, Bihar, total 68 papers were presented by different participants. The chief guest of the valedictory session was Dr. Vishwajeet



Satpati, Sambhalpur University, Odisha. He highlighted the importance of entrepreneurship in the development of the economy and also stated that don't be a job seeker, but a job creator.

As a Co- Convenor of the seminar, Prof. Sanjay Pandey presented a report of the National seminar and summarized all the sessions of the seminar and he also highlighted the takeaways of the seminar. Valedictory session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Shailesh Dwivedi, Organizing Secretary of the National Seminar.
