Abstract

Purpose: To study the status of Micro finance in Meghalaya state by comparing and evaluating the performance of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in the state with the national scenario and also to study the impact of micro finance on sustainable development of the state.

Methodology: Descriptive research, based on published and unpublished reviewed secondary data.

Findings: At India level the Self-Help group model is leading the chart of micro finance as compared by the MFI model. In respect of Savings of SHGs with banks there is a continuous growth in the year of study both in Meghalaya and India as a whole.
