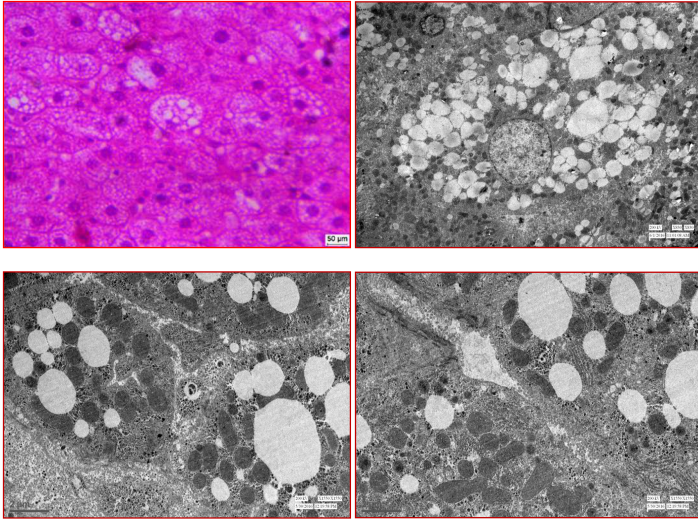

Tuberculosis (TB) is one of the serious fatal contagious diseases leading innumerable deaths globally. Isoniazid (INH) is a synthetic antimycobacterial agent used to treat TB. INH broadly utilized as the front line of anti-TB treatment. During drug administration to tuberculosis patients, the incidence of adverse reactions due to inflammation in the liver is high that severely affects clinical treatment. INH-based tuberculosis treatment presents a main challenge for TB control programs worldwide. Present chapter described the hepatotoxic effects of INH and provide a summary of the mechanisms and their applications in prediction and prevention of INH hepatotoxicity in clinical practice.
