Brief Abstract of the Event

Mati (clay) Kala art, is a traditional craft that involves shaping and molding clay into artistic and functional objects. This ancient art form has been practiced for centuries, particularly in India, where it holds cultural and religious significance. From intricately designed pottery and terracotta sculptures to diyas (oil lamps) and decorative figurines, Mati Kala showcases the creativity and craftsmanship of artisans.

The art of working with clay is deeply rooted in rural traditions, with many communities relying on it as a primary livelihood. The process involves sourcing natural clay, shaping it by hand or using a potter's wheel, and then firing it in kilns to achieve durability. Some pieces are left in their natural earthy tones, while others are adorned with vibrant colors and intricate patterns.

Mati Kala is not only an artistic expression but also an eco-friendly craft, as clay is biodegradable and sustainable. Despite modernization, efforts are being made to preserve and promote this traditional art, ensuring that it continues to thrive in contemporary times.

Hence, a three-day Workshop on Mati Kala Art was organized for University UG & PG students from March 26, 27, & 28, 2025.

Objectives of the Prorgamme were: the workshop enables the participants to;

- Provide participants with an understanding of the history, significance, and cultural relevance of Mati Kala (clay art).
- Teach basic and advanced clay modeling techniques, including hand-building, coiling, and slab work, to create artistic and functional clay objects.
- Encourage creativity and innovation by allowing participants to design and sculpt unique clay artworks.
- Introduce various decorating techniques such as engraving, embossing, painting, and glazing to enhance the aesthetic appeal of clay creations.

- Educate participants on the process of drying, firing, and preserving clay artifacts to ensure durability and longevity.
- Promote sustainable and eco-friendly practices in clay art by using natural materials and environmentally responsible methods.
- Develop an appreciation for the rich heritage of Mati Kala and its role in traditional and contemporary art forms.

Hence, Department of Education, and Skill Development Cell, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh has jointly organised a three-day offline workshop on "Mati Kala Art" on March 26, 27 & 28, 2025.
