Jain discussed the process of writing books and book chapters, offering guidance on structuring content and ensuring coherence. His session provided a roadmap for researchers looking to expand their contributions into more comprehensive publications. The final speaker, Dr. V. Mandal, covered the intricacies of filing patents. He explained the process of protecting intellectual property rights in research, which was particularly relevant to participants working on innovative projects. His session provided valuable insights into patent application procedures and safeguarding original research work.
